S.D. College, Muzaffarnagar is a college dedicated to the cause of education for the students belonging to the under privileged classes and the rural areas situated in the peripheries of Muzaffarnagar. The college was established in 1949 and since then it is the fountain of knowledge in this area, where many come to quench their thirst of knowledge. S.D. College is an aided college and some courses are self-financed, hence two different policies are adopted. The students studying in aided sections of the college are provided concessions and scholarships according to the regulations of the Uttar Pradesh government and the students studying in self- financed sections get fee concessions by the management. Only the bonafide students of S.D. College are entitled for a concession or complete waiver of tuition fees.

## **Eligibility**:

All the students who fulfill these basic eligibility can apply for scholarship:

- Father should not be in government job.
- Income should be less than 2 lakh and 2.5 lakh for OBC and SC categories, respectively.
- Candidate can avail only one kind of scholarship at a time.
- Attendance should be more than 75% in the classes.



Eligibility for freeship in aided college :

- The tuition fee of all girls' students is waived.
- If an eligible candidate applies for fee concession.

Eligibility for self-financed freeship: Freeship can be awarded by the management in the following cases:

- If a candidate belongs to a very poor family and is unable to pay the fees.
- Fee concession can be given to students whose siblings are studying in the self-financed courses.
- Fee concession can be given to meritorious students.

## **Application process for scholarship:**

For availing the government provided scholarship the eligible candidates have to fill a form offered by the department of social welfare. This form is scrutinized by the office and after being digitally signed by the principal, it is uploaded on the website – upscholarship.ac.in. Then the department of social welfare verifies the forms and sends the scholarships for eligible candidates.







## **Application process for fee concession for self-financed courses:**

If a candidate who is eligible applies for fee concession, his/her application is first verified by the office and principal and then it is presented before a committee headed by the honorary secretary and manager. Fee concession or fee waiver depends on the discretion of the management.

#### Conditions for Termination of awarded scholarship

The fee concession and scholarship may be terminated at any time in the case the candidate furnishes wrong details / particulars in his/her application or is found guilty of misconduct or violation of any rule of the college.
